About Marcia



Marcia J. Bunge is Professor of Humanities and Theology at Christ College, the Honours college of Valparaiso University, and Director of "The Child in Religion and Ethics Project." Her current area of research is religious understandings of children and childhood, and she has edited or co-edited four significant volumes on the subject: *The Child in Christian Thought* (Eerdmans, 2001); *The Child in the Bible* (Eerdmans, 2008); *Children and Childhood in World Religions: Primary Sources and Texts* (Rutgers, 2009); and *Children, Adults, and Shared Responsibilities: Jewish, Christian, and Muslim Perspectives* (Cambridge, 2012). She is editing a fifth volume on *Child Theologies: Perspectives from World Christianity*.

Marcia also serves on the international board of the Child Theology Movement and the steering committees of the "Children in the Biblical World" section of the Society of Biblical Literature and the "Childhood Studies and Religion" section of the American Academy of Religion. Marcia received her B.A. in English and Music from St. Olaf College and her M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Chicago.
